
The Wrangler National Finals Rodeo, coming up in Las Vegas December 3–12, 2015, is the culmination of a yearlong struggle on the wide-open rodeo road. Professional cowboys and cowgirls have vied for a coveted spot in the top 15 of their respective events so they can take their place in the Thomas & Mack Center arena for 10 nights of rodeo action, battling on dirt for a chunk of an unprecedented \$10 million in prize money and a chance to be crowned world champion.

HERE ARE A FEW YOU'LL WANT TO WATCH:

The reigning world champion bull rider, Sage Kimzey, shattered records last year as only the second rookie bull rider in the history of rodeo to win a world title. This year, his dominance at the top of the standings has continued, and he's well-positioned to be a repeat champion. Kimzey is no rookie anymore.

It's only fitting that Kimzey's travel partner and fellow Oklahoman, bull rider Brennon Eldred, would pace him in season earnings. They call themselves the #580 crew for their area code, and with Eldred, Oklahoma stands a good chance of having another world champion bull rider, even if it's not Kimzey.


With a father and three uncles breaking a record for the number of brothers to qualify for the same NFR, Rusty Wright knows that world titles in saddle bronc riding are plentiful on his family tree. This year, he'll qualify for his first trip to the Thomas & Mack Center and might just take home a title of his own.

Looking to defend their 2014 world championship will be team roping powerhouses Clay Tryan and Jade Corkill. Perhaps they know best that you can't do it alone when it comes to hitting the rodeo jackpot in Vegas.





THERE'S PLENTY YOU DON'T WANT TO MISS BEYOND THE ARENA TOO:

If champions are crowned inside the arena, they and thousands of other rodeo fans are outfitted, entertained, and even married outside of it.

This year Cowboy Christmas, the shopping and event extravaganza surrounding NFR, will be bigger than ever—so big, in fact, that it's moving from the North Halls to the South Halls of the Las Vegas Convention Center for more room. From the latest in Western fashion, jewelry, and lifestyle trends to skilled artisans showcasing their wares, the shopping is second to none. You'll find Cowboys & Indians at Booth 1431.

Things are going to get a lot wilder in the convention center with the expansion of the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation Hunter & Outdoor Christmas Expo, extended this year to last all 10 days of the trade show in conjunction with Cowboy Christmas. Plus, the interactive elements of Cowboy Christmas will be back with the Wrangler Rodeo Arena, where miniature rough stock competitions will be in full swing along with showcases in horsemanship and roping. Rodeo Live presented by RodeoHouston brings a little Hollywood to the desert with shows like Flint Rasmussen's Outside the Barrel and Alexis Bloomer Live as well as programming from RFD-TV's live studio broadcasts.

And what's Vegas without a wedding? Head to the Get Hitched Wedding Chapel presented by B&W Trailer Hitches where you can literally marry the cowboy of your dreams, and then run off to the Coors Rodeo Saloon to grab a bite to eat and relive the glory from the previous night's rodeo. If you'd rather watch somebody else wear the dress, check out the Miss Rodeo America Pageant held at the MGM Grand Hotel & Casino from November 29 to December 6.

Once the curtains close on the nightly performances at the Thomas & Mack Center, make sure and see the champions crowned in person at the Go-Round Buckle Presentations at South Point Hotel Casino & Spa. Rodeo Vegas at The Mirage Hotel & Casino is the official NFR after-party of the PRCA. The MGM Grand's Gold Buckle Zone will host free concerts by the likes of Scotty McCreery, Blackberry Smoke, Craig Wayne Boyd, and other musical acts. Tanya Tucker, Trace Adkins, and Merle Haggard are a few of the big-name acts performing at the Golden Nugget Las Vegas during the NFR. Reba and Brooks & Dunn have an eight-night stand at Caesars Palace, and Gary Leffew's Legendary Buck'N Ball, Charlie Daniels Band, and the National Finals Tonight Show at The Orleans Hotel and Casino aren't to be missed either.
